

Proposal type	Details
<b>Minor and machinery in nature</b>	<p>This proposal is minor and machinery to amend the <i>Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Regulation 2019</i> to include two new approved entities who conduct an accreditation scheme for persons who breed dogs. The Department of Primary Industries received two applications from organisations seeking to become approved entities. Becoming an approved entity is voluntary, and both applicants, on becoming approved entities, will be bound by the requirements of the Act and Regulation.</p> <p>Presently, there are four approved entities under the regulation: (a) Canine Control Council (Queensland) Ltd ACN 160 285 192; (b) the Gold Coast City Council; (c) the Logan City Council; (d) the Queensland Racing Integrity Commission.</p> <p>The amendment does not result in a substantive change to regulatory policy, impacts on business, government or the community. The amendment to include two new approved entities benefits government and community by increasing better regulation of dog breeders in Queensland. Each approved entity ensures members meet strict standards for breeding dogs and manages their members through the Queensland Dog Breeder Register.</p>
