Name of the proposal	Evidence and Other Legislation Amendment Regulation 2025, which amends the Evidence Regulation 2017 to prescribe the Childrens Court in Brisbane, Townsville, Caboolture, Cleveland and Redcliffe as places within the definition of a relevant proceeding in relation to the sexual offence expert evidence panel, prescribes notice requirements for a party seeking to adduce tendency evidence or coincidence evidence in a relevant proceeding, and which amends the Uniform Civil Procedure (Fees) Regulation 2019 to exempt a person filing an application for a complainant privacy order from paying a fee and to correct a previous typographical error which has resulted in an incorrect filing fee.
