Name of the proposal	<i>Evidence and Other Legislation Amendment Regulation 2025</i> , which amends the <i>Evidence Regulation 2017</i> to prescribe the Childrens Court in Brisbane, Townsville, Caboolture, Cleveland and Redcliffe as places within the definition of a relevant proceeding in relation to the sexual offence expert evidence panel, prescribes notice requirements for a party seeking to adduce tendency evidence or coincidence evidence in a relevant proceeding, and which amends the <i>Uniform Civil Procedure (Fees) Regulation 2019</i> to exempt a person filing an application for a complainant privacy order from paying a fee and to correct a previous typographical error which has resulted in an incorrect filing fee.

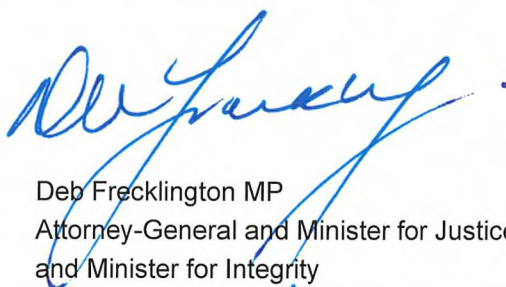
