Proposal type	Details
Regulatory proposals where no RIA is required	The Queensland Community Safety Act 2024 (the Act) received assent on 30 August 2024, with certain amendments scheduled to commence automatically one year after the assent day, on 31 August 2025.
	Section 15DA(3) of the <i>Acts Interpretation Act 1954</i> allows for a regulation to be made to extend the period before commencement of part of an Act by up to two years from the date of assent.
	The Queensland Community Safety (Postponement) Regulation (No.2) 2025 postpones the commencement of particular amendments for a further period of 12 months, and fixes a new commencement date of 31 August 2026.
	The postponement is required to resolve operational and implementation issues, including technical limitations.
	The amendments proposed for postponement include the introduction of electronic service provisions for two types of police documents, being official warnings for consorting and initial police banning notices.
	The Queensland Police Service (QPS) has assessed the Regulation as machinery in nature as it simply has the effect of delaying commencement of specific amendments in the Act that are not yet in force, for a period of 12 months.
	The QPS has identified no further regulatory impact analysis is required under the Queensland Government Better Regulation Policy.
